Field Agent's Report

PERMANENT LIFE INSURANCE

Why should you buy permanent life insurance? Unlike term insurance, permanent insurance lasts a lifetime while term insurance expires and is meant to cover a temporary need. And this is what we would call a "ten year certain", meaning that if you do die, we'll continue to pay your beneficiary that amount until 10 years has passed.

The satisfaction of knowing that your family will be financially sound and will not have to worry about remaining in the family's home if you are not around is priceless.
